Extent: 3 folders The Richard Ryder Papers primarily contains correspondence to his parents while he was deployed on USS Intrepid. The letters discuss his job in Intrepid's pharmacy, goings on in sick bay and in port, as well as planning visits home. Some of the letters discuss an accident in which three crew members, including Hospital Corpsman Richard Gauthier, were killed by hydrogen sulfide gas. Stationery in the collection include USS Intrepid stationery and one letter with stationery featuring Peanuts characters, such as Snoopy and Charlie Brown.
