Photograph, Black and white; Square, official, aerial image looking down on Roi Island in the Marshall Islands. The island has recently been bombed. The land stretches across the bottom half of the image, and a beach runs

around the edge. Many locations have been hit by bombs and are smoking. A plane is visible in the upper left quadrant. A ship is in the water in the upper right quadrant. Typed at the bottom of the image is, "INT. 2 129-44 2030 G.C.T. 20" ROI conf." A clock face is in the lower right corner. A black border is around the image, and there are tabs in the center of each edge. The left border has, "Eastman regular safety" running down it.
