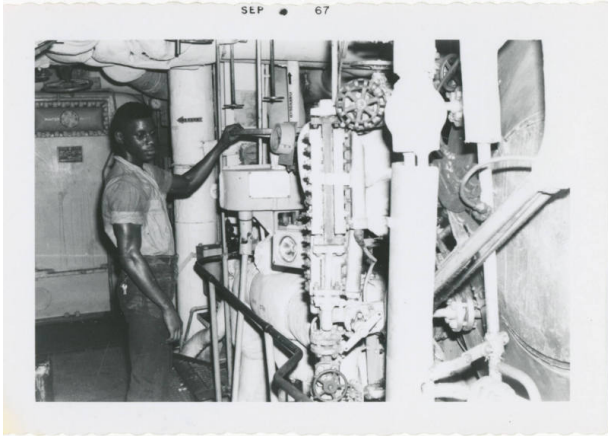

## Adjusting a Feed Check Valve

### Description
